I. God completing in us the good work he has begun until the day of Jesus Christi (Phil. 1:6)

- A. Receiving and experiencing God's saving life (Acts 16:11-40; Acts 4:12)
 - 1. God is life and light (John 1:1-4)
 - 2. Receiving eternal life in Jesus (John 1:12-13; John 17:3)
 - 3. Faith and baptism in Philippi (Acts 16:14-15; Hebr. 7:25)

B. Knowing God's purpose and making ourselves one with Him (Phil. 3:12-13; 1.Cor. 8:2)

- 1. When the heart turns to the Lord, glory is manifested (2.Cor. 3:16-18)
- 2. Jesus wants to build His church with us (Matt. 16:18)
- 3. The reality of the church life in our locality today (Acts 2:42-47)
- 4. Our citizenship: the holy city, Jerusalem out of heaven from God (Rev. 21:10; Phil. 3:20-21)

C. Being perfected by faith and in oneness with all the saints (Phil. 1:9-11; 3:20-21)

- 1. Comprehending in love with all the saints (Eph. 3:17-18)
- 2. Proofing the things which differ (which are not Christ)
- 3. Being pure and without offense

II. The good work of Christ (Phil. 1:1-11)

A. Christ and the church – the purpose and the treasure of our life (Phil. 1:1-2)

- 1. The church in Philippi is formed (Acts 16:6-40)
- 2. We need an ear to hear and an understanding and an obedient heart (Rev. 2:7; Ezek. 2:7; 3:10-11; Acts 20:27; Eph. 5:17; John 21:21-22)
- 3. The decision of our heart to live a life dedicated to the church (2.Tim. 2:1-4, 7, 9-10; Ps. 123:1-2; John 17:20-23)

B. The local church life – Unity in reality (Phil. 1:3-8)

- 1. Our prayer with joy and thanksgiving, making request for our brothers and sisters (Phil. 1:3-4; 1.Cor. 12:18, 22-27)
- 2. Fighting together to build up the church (Phil. 1:5, 7; Phil. 2:20, 30; Hebr. 3:12-14)
- 3. A work to express unity in a locality (Phil. 1:6; Eph. 2:10, 14-16)

C. Unity in a locality glorifies the Father (Phil. 1:9-11)

- 1. Abounding in love in all knowledge and discernment living our Lord together (Phil. 3:8a; 2.Thess. 1:3-5, 11-12; Col. 2:1-4)
- 2. Proofing the things which differ—the preciousness of the church (Rev. 3:11; 1.Thess. 3:11-13; 2.Cor. 11:2-3; Col. 2:8; Rom. 16:17-18)
- 3. The father wants to be glorified by the unity of His redeemed all glory is due to the Lord (Eph. 1:6, 12, 14; Rom. 15:5-6)

III. Living Christ (Phil. 1:12-30)

A. Fellowship in the gospel

(Phil. 1:5-6, 12, 19-21)

- 1. From the first day until now (Phil. 1:5)
- 2. Our personal circumstances should turn out for the furtherance of the gospel (Phil. 1:12)
- 3. The gospel is a matter for the church (Acts 2:4;
- 1. Cor. 14:24-25; Eph. 3:8-10; Rev. 22:17)

B. Magnifying Christ in our body

- 1. Everything turns out for our salvation (Phil. 1:19)
 - a) Through the prayer of the saints
 - b) Through the supply of the spirit of Jesus Christ
- 2. Our expectation: Not to be ashamed in anything
- 3. With all boldness Christ shall be magnified in our body (whether by life or by death)
- 4. For me to live is Christ (Phil. 1:21)

C. Serving the saints

- 1. Fruit from our labour as a result of our consecration to the church (Phil. 1:22)
- 2. Helping the saints for their progress and joy (Phil. 1:24-25; Hebr. 6:10; 2.Cor. 1:24; Is. 50:4)

C. A conduct worthy of the gospel of Christ

- 1. A life in accordance with the gospel (Eph. 4:1-6)
- 2. Standing fast in one spirit; the unity of the spirit (Eph. 4:1-6)
- 3. Striving together with one soul (Phil. 1:27)
- 4. The world can know God through the unity of the church (John 17:22-23)

IV. The mind of Christ for the unity of the believers in a locality (Phil. 2:1-16)

- A. God has provided everything for us so that we can be built up with all the saints in our locality (Phil. 2:1-2)
 - 1. To keep the unity our mind must be renewed, i.e. we need the mind of Christ (Eph. 4:23-24; Rom. 12:2)
 - 2. The nature of the mind of Christ (Phil. 2:3-8; John 13:1-5, 14-17)
 - a. Free from self ambition
 - b. In lowliness esteeming others better than oneself
 - c. Also look for the interests of others
- B. Not to dispute over opinions, but rather resolving this, not to put a stumbling block in our brother's way (Rom. 14)
 - 1. Trusting that God will give revelation (Phil. 3:15; John 6:37, 44)
 - 2. If we humble ourselves under the mighty hand of God, He will exalt us in due time (Phil. 2:8-11; 1.Petr. 5:5-7)
- C. We can work out our own salvation, for it is God who works in us both to will and to do (Phil. 2:12-13)

V. Knowing Jesus Christ (Phil. 3:1-11)

A. Paul's concern to protect the brothers (Phil. 3:1; Jn. 17:11-12)

- 1. Hearing the same things again is a protection (2.Tim. 3:14-15; 2.Pe. 1:12, 19)
- 2. Beware of evil workers and do not put your trust in men (cf. 2. Co. 11; 1.Th. 2:13-16)
- 3. We are the circumcision, who serve by the Spirit of God and boast in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh (Phil. 3:3)

B. Knowing Christ

- 1. As to zeal, persecuting the church (Phil. 3:6; 1.Co. 15:9; 1.Tim. 1:13)
- 2. Revelation about Christ and the church (Acts 9:5; Eph. 5:32)
- 3. Knowing Christ together (Acts 9:10-18; Song. 1:8; Acts 18:25-26)

C. That I may gain Christ

- 1. Paul rejects his former life (Ga. 1:13-14; Acts 22:3)
- 2. Suffering the loss of all things and counting them refuse (Mk. 10:21; Mt. 4:22; Lu. 18:29-30)
- 3. The way to experience Christ daily: Not having your own righteousness of the law, but through faith (Ga. 3:11; He. 10:37-38)
- 4. Being conformed to His death the liberating effect of the cross (Song. 2:14)
- 5. Attaining by any means to the out-resurrection (Phil.3:11)

VI. Laying hold of Christ, our prize

(Phil. 3:10-16)

- A. Christ is precious (1.Pe. 2:4-7)
 - 1. Such as Paul, also we as His church want to know Him, lay hold of Him and pursue Him (Rev. 3:10-13),
 - 2. Not remaining idle or unfruitful (2.Pe. 1:8)
 - 3. Much more attaining to the out-resurrection when the Lord comes back (Rev. 20:6)
 - 4. Enjoying the foretaste today, and when He returns the full reward (Eph. 1:13-14; 2.Co. 1:22; 2.Co. 5:5)
- **B.** We have not yet laid hold, but we pursue (Phil. 3:12-14)
 - 1. We lay hold of together for which we have been laid hold of by Christ
 - 2. We forget the things of the past and stretch forward to the things which are before
 - 3. We pursue toward the goal for the prize
- C. Those who have grown in the Lord should pursue this goal (Phil. 3:15)
- **D.** Whereunto we have attained, let us walk in it (Phil. 3:16; He. 13:8-9; 1.Jn. 1:1-2)

VII. The eager expectation of our Savior and the manifestation of His masterpiece (Phil. 3:17-21)

- A. Being laid hold of by Christ to walk in an exemplary manner (1.Pe. 1:15; Eph. 5:2, 8-10; Phil. 1:9-11; 2:15-16)
 - 1. Not being enemies of the cross (Mt. 7:21-23; Eph. 4:17-21; He. 12:16)
 - a. The cross against the flesh (Ga. 5:24; 6:12)
 - b. The cross towards the world (Ga. 6:14; Mk. 4:7, 18-19; Lu. 8:7, 14; James 4:4; 1.Jn. 2:15-17)
 - c. The cross against the soul life / the ego and against vainglory (Ga. 2:19-20; Mt. 16:24-25; Mk. 8:34-35; Jn. 5:44; Mt. 24:(45-47), 48-51; Mt. 25:(14-23), 24-30; He. 12:15)
 - 2. Putting to death the practices of the body through the Spirit and gaining oil to be transformed in the soul (Ro. 8:13; Eph. 5:18-21; 2.Co. 3:18; Mt. 25:1-13)
 - 3. Acquiring the marriage garment through our walk and our righteous acts (Mt. 22:2, 10-14; Rev. 3:4-5, 18; 7:9, 13-14; 16:15; 19:8, 14)

B. Our citizenship is in the heavens

(1.Co. 15:47-49; Ga. 3:27-28; Col. 3:10-11)

- Eagerly awaiting our Lord Jesus Christ who will come like a thief to pick us up (Lu. 12:35-40; Mk. 13:(24-31), 32-37; Mt. 24:(29-36), 40-44; Rev. 3:2-3; 14:14-16; 16:15; 22:12, 20)
- 2. The transfiguration of the body of our humiliation into a body of His glory (1.Th. 5:23; Ro. 8:23; 1.Co. 15:42-44, 50-54)
- 3. The manifestation of his masterpiece (Ps. 48:1-2; 50:2; 102:16; 110:2; Joel 3:16-17; Mi. 4:7-8; Zech. 8:3; Ro. 8:18-21; 2.Th. 1:10; Rev. 3:10-12; 14:1, 4-5; 7:9, 13-17; 19:7-9)

VIII. Being completed with all saints as one in the church (Phil. 4)

A. Standing firm together, being one in the Lord (Phil. 4:1)

- 1. Our basis: in one spirit we are all one in Christ (Eph. 4: 3-6, 13; 1.Co. 12:13; Ga. 3:28)
- 2. Our sphere: in life and nature we are one such as the Father and the Son (Jn. 17:20-26)
- 3. Our cooperation and our joy: Thinking the same thing in the Lord (Phil. 4:2-4; Eph. 4:13)

B. Holding forth together the testimony of our oneness in the world (Phil. 1:1; 2:14-16; cf. Jn. 17:21, 23)

- 1. Being one with each other (Phil. 4:2; Acts 4:32a)
- 2. Being joined in soul, thinking the same thing and having the same love (Phil. 2:2)
- 3. Being obedient to the Lord and counting one another more excellent than oneself (Phil. 2:3-4, 12-13)
- 4. Consecrating yourself practically for the saints (Phil. 2:4, 17-18, 20-21, 25, 29-30; 4:8-10; Acts 20:24; Ro 16:1-4)

C. Seeing His glory in the church until His work is completed (Phil. 4:20; Jn. 17:22, 24)

- 1. Learning through Christ to be pure, without offense, without blemish, guileless unto the day of Christ
 - (Phil. 1:10; 2:15; 4:8-9)
- 2. In Christ, everything can be filled in us in glory for His good pleasure (Phil. 2:13; 4:18-19)
- 3. Now to our God and Father be the glory forever and ever. Amen. (Phil. 4:20)
